

# Student Affairs Joint Staff Highlights: February 26, 2015 Enrollment Update:

- Freshman applications up 8%
- YTD confirmations up 7%
- Average GPA 3.6
- SATs up 12 points (Currently 1141)
- Honors College up 41%
- Total credit hours up, while grad enrollment continues to decline

#### P3:

The Friends building at Piedmont and Dobbs has been torn down. The Gourmet Services building next door is scheduled to be demolished this Saturday. This location is for the next on-campus housing project will add 1152 new beds and 24 hour dining hall, scheduled to open Fall 2016.

#### **National Health Issues:**

There are currently two known cases of Chicken Pox on campus.

We offer religious exemption for immunizations, but students are required to sign a waiver, and if there is an outbreak, they may be barred from campus.

# **Consolidation:**

- The consolidation is moving forward very quickly
- Currently working on strategic documentation to submit to SACS and continued accreditation

- There is one main committee with 20 members, 10 from Georgia State and 10 from GPC
- There are several smaller, operational working groups, two for Student Affairs, Dr. Stout is the co-chair of one, and Dr. Holloman the co-chair of the other

#### **Annual Report: (Handout provided)**

- The overview is similar to what we provide for SACS, eliminating the need to duplicate work
- Think of each heading as a chapter (and sometimes they will not be applicable)
- Similar to our web presences, staff development, etc., it is important that we clean this up before the consolidation
- We are going to standardize our Annual Reports, web presences, etc., so we can sustain our growing division
- An appendix will be added for budget
- Timeline: July 15, with the budget data to be added later

#### **Budgets:**

Shantavia has just completed the Board of Regents business plans reports. Business plans are due in February each year. It would be beneficial for all supervisors responsible for budgets to review their report with Shantavia.



### **Broadening Engagement Initiative:**

Everything we do should be broadly represented by **who we are**. We must make an effort to represent who we are in SGA, Leadership, Orientation, and every opportunity where it is possible.
